Dear Sculpture Participant,

We are excited about our summer workshop offerings and look forward to your arrival at Anderson Ranch. Please take a look at the list of materials that your faculty has asked you to bring to the workshop. In order for you to get the most from your time here, I've included a general template of events that commonly occur during a typical "Ranch" week:

Sunday. Students staying in our housing arrive on Sunday. Dinner in our café is at 6 PM. This is an opportunity to meet fellow students, faculty and staff.

The Week. Breakfast is served Monday – Friday in the Café starting at 7:30 AM. We begin at 8:45 AM Monday morning with a welcoming orientation hosted by Ranch staff in the Schermer meeting hall. During this 15-minute introduction, you will be introduced to the Ranch staff and the faculty on campus that week. Immediately following the general orientation, we have a brief workshop orientation in the Sculpture Studio.

In general, our workshops meet weekdays from 9 AM – 5 PM with a one-hour break for lunch. Activities may include lectures, slide talks, demos, field trips, individual assignments, studio work and critiques.

You will have 24-hour access to our facilities beginning Monday morning after orientation and ending on Friday at 5 PM. Staff will be available in the studios Monday to Friday 9 AM – 5 PM and in the evenings Monday to Thursday 7 – 10 PM. Some restrictions may be applied to certain tools due to noise and safety concerns in the evenings.

On Friday afternoon, there will be a shipping service available. This is also a good time to have wrap-up discussions, refreshments and snacks. The workshop formally ends at 5pm on Friday.

Lectures. Slide presentations by featured artists and visiting faculty are scheduled Sunday and Tuesday evenings at 7 PM and some Thursday s at 12:30 PM. Most lectures are free and open to the public. Check the chalkboards around campus for the exact schedule of events during the week of your workshop. Attendance is encouraged.

Auctionettes. Your workshop may coincide with a Friday Auctionette. Starting at 11:45 these exciting lunchtime events auction work by students, staff and faculty alike. Proceeds fund programming at Anderson Ranch. All students are welcome to contribute a piece of work and are invited to bid at their leisure.

Activities. The Ranch is situated in a scenic mountain area with easy access to walking and hiking trails. Snowmass Village also has a beautiful recreation center with a saline pool and modern gym. Aspen with it's shops & restaurants is a 20-minute bus ride away.

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As part of your studio fee we will provide the following:

- Glues, nails & screws
- Sandpaper & grinding discs
- Basic hardware and finishing supplies
- Butcher paper for large format drawings
- Welding wire & gas
- Steel & lumber scraps
- Whole pieces of steel & lumber are available for purchase from the studio

Please bring the following to your workshop:

- Safety clothing including: denim jeans, long-sleeved cotton shirt, leather & rubber,* gloves that fit your hands nicely, Hair bands, and closed-toed leather shoes or boots.
- Any materials that you may want to use to pack up your project to take home. Some examples might be moving blankets, packing tape, bubble wrap or boxes. (The Anderson Ranch store has bubble wrap and packing tape for sale and may have recycled boxes available free first come first served.)
- We will have Smooth-On products for sale
 - Smooth Cast 325 plastic
 - Mold Max Stroke silicon
 - Colormatch Dies

Optional additional tools and materials:

- The studio is equipped with safety glasses, hearing protectors, welding gloves and welding helmets. But if you own your own you may wish to bring them. Dust masks and earplugs are also provided.
- Reusable water bottle
- Mini flashlight. Some nighttime paths are very dark.
- Sketch book with ideas of furniture and design

Getting your supplies to the Ranch:

ArtWorks, the Anderson Ranch Art Store, carries art supplies, tools, materials, other resources and artwork. If you plan to purchase your materials from ArtWorks, please call in advance and reserve your materials (970-923-3181).

You are welcome to ship your supplies to the Ranch via UPS or FedEx. We ask that you ship them to arrive at the Ranch no more than one week prior to your workshop start date, as we have limited storage. All UPS and FedEx packages must arrive at the Ranch clearly labeled as shown below. Unidentified packages will not be signed for and will be returned.
