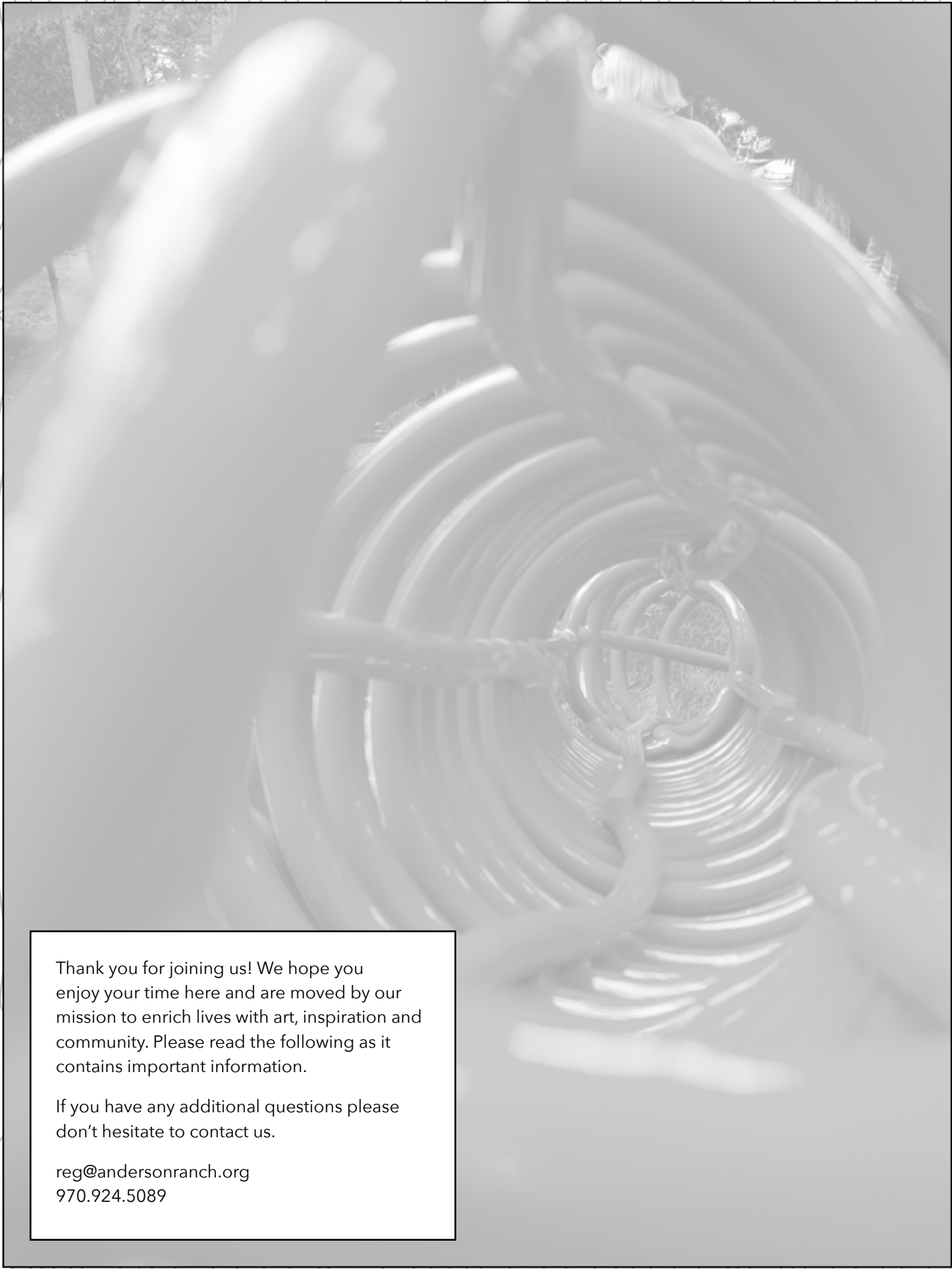

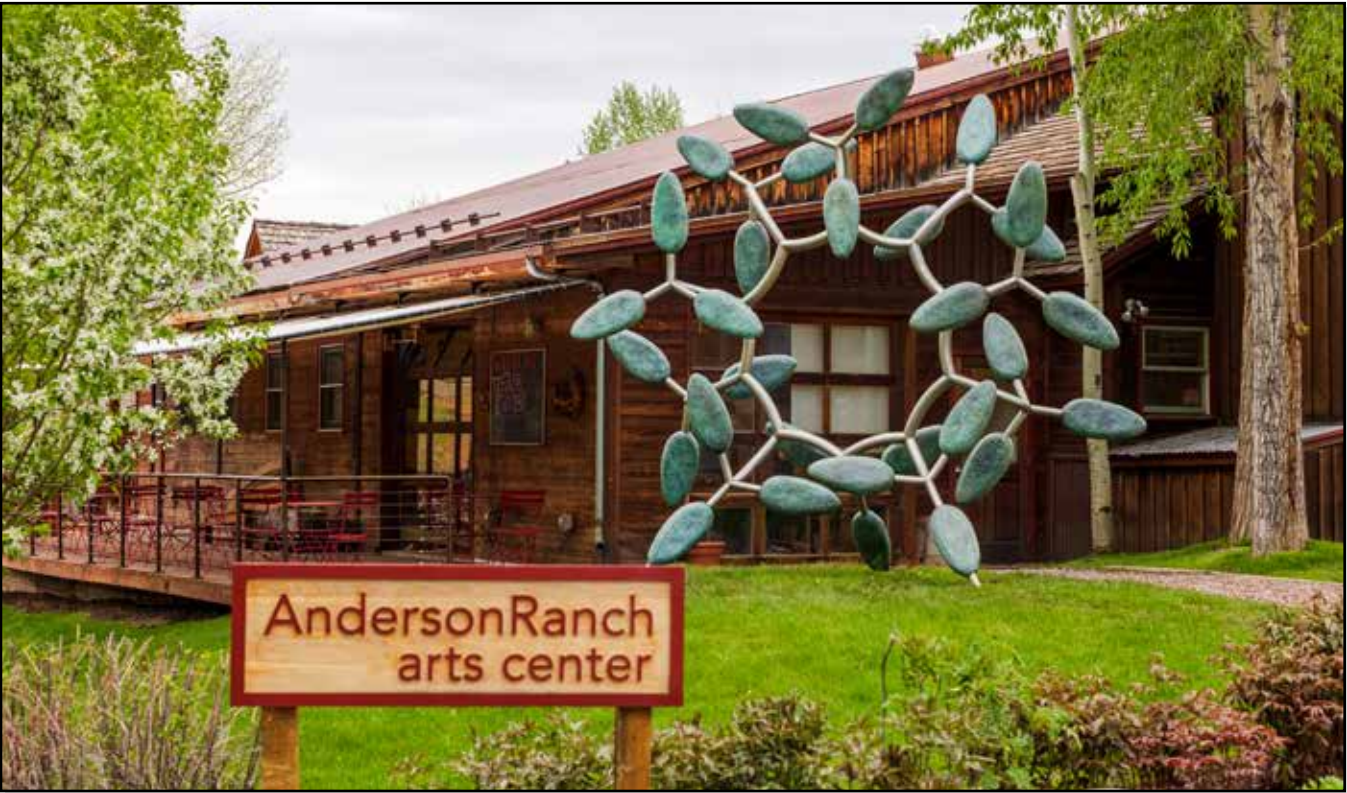
INTRODUCTION

Welcome to Anderson Ranch! We are excited to welcome you to your workshop experience. This handbook along with the visitor information on our website will help you get the most out of your visit. Workshops help you see yourself and your work from a new perspective. Your growth may be as straightforward as learning a new technique or as expansive as provoking a new life's path. It is likely that your workshop will unfold differently than you imagined; embrace the experience. If you have taken workshops in the past, remember that no two are alike, but all are sure to inspire you beyond your wildest expectations. Inspiration has always been a part of the mission of the Ranch, and that has not changed. Workshops generally meet from 9AM to 5PM, Monday through Friday, with an hour break for lunch, unless stated otherwise in the course description.

Workshops are intensive experiences, and participants may find themselves in the studios in the evenings. You can expect Anderson Ranch to operate with your health and safety as our number one priority. Due to safety concerns, students may have limited access to certain equipment during evening and non-class hours. Additional studio hours will take place from 7-9PM, Monday-Thursday.

In signing up for your workshop(s), you have made a commitment to attend in full. Arriving late, departing early, or missing class in the middle of the day is disruptive. Please come prepared to participate in a positive and constructive manner, and be ready to engage with the instructor, the course material and the other students.

The student handbook provides information about how to get to the Ranch and other important logistical details. In addition to this handbook, please carefully read our visitor information on the website, your course description and supply list. Familiarity with these will ensure that when you arrive at Anderson Ranch you can immerse yourself in your workshop without delay. SCHEDULE & EVENTS

ORIENTATION

Monday morning at 8:45AM there will be a short general orientation in Schermer Meeting Hall. We encourage all students to attend, as important announcements and updates are made, and workshop instructors and Anderson Ranch staff are introduced. If your workshop does not begin on a Monday morning (e.g., evening or weekend workshops), please refer to the workshop supply list or itinerary for your orientation schedule and location.

GUEST FACULTY LECTURES

We offer free public lectures by workshop faculty members and invited featured artists several times each week, June through September. Lectures begin at 7PM. Please check the [Summer Events Calendar](#) on our website (www.andersonranch.org) for the schedule during your stay; information is also posted on chalk boards outside the main office and the Schermer Meeting Hall.

WORKSHOP MEETING TIMES

Workshops generally meet from 9AM to 5PM, Monday through Friday, with an hour break for lunch, unless stated otherwise in the course description. Workshops are intensive experiences, and participants may find themselves in the studios in the evenings. Studios are monitored Monday-Thursday evening from 7-9PM.

FIRST SUNDAY WELCOME DINNER

If your workshop begins on Monday morning, you are invited to join us for dinner in our Café Sunday evening. Dinner is served from 6 to 7PM.

ACCESSIBILITY

Anderson Ranch Arts Center is a historic, rustic campus that features gravel pathways and uneven terrain that may pose challenges for individuals using wheelchairs or other mobility devices. We strive to provide accommodations to ensure all guests can access and enjoy our programs and facilities. With advance notice, our staff can offer personalized assistance and coordinate access to studios and campus spaces. LODGING

Lodging offerings are limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis. The earlier you reserve lodging, the better your chance of receiving your preferred option. Anderson Ranch is offering single and double occupancy lodging options for Summer 2026. Rates reflect six nights of accommodations Sunday evening through Saturday morning. A sales and lodging tax of 13.05% will be added at the time of registration. To guarantee your lodging reservation, payment is due in full 60 days prior to the start date of your stay. Smoking and pets are not permitted at Anderson Ranch or in Anderson Ranch-provided lodging.

LODGING CANCELLATION POLICY

To cancel lodging and receive a refund, notify us at least 60 days before the start of your lodging reservation. If we are given the required 60 days' notice, we will refund your payment less a \$200 cancellation fee per week of lodging reserved. No refunds will be issued for cancellations made within 60 days of the start of the lodging reservation.



LODGING

ROOM & BOARD

Room & Board includes six nights of accommodations as well as select meals. A sales and lodging tax of 13.05% is added to the lodging portion at the time of registration. To guarantee your housing reservation, payment is due in full 60 days prior to the start date of your stay. Smoking and pets are not permitted at Anderson Ranch or in Anderson Ranch-provided housing.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Wyly House is a two-story, co-ed building conveniently located on the Anderson Ranch campus and is situated between the Ranch Café and the Snowmass Club golf course. There are 18 clean and modest bedrooms with private or shared bathrooms and a lounge. Each room is equipped with a mini refrigerator and microwave.

Guest are provided with one set of linens and bath towels are provided. Routine cleaning of housing during the week is limited to common spaces and commonly touched surfaces. Students under the age of 18 are not permitted to stay in The Wyly House dormitory or in any Ranch-provided lodging. Students can secure transfer from the Aspen/Pitkin County Airport (ASE) to Anderson Ranch via the Roaring Fork Transportation Authority free bus service or by High Mountain Taxi Aspen.

CHECK-IN/OUT

Check-in begins at noon on the Sunday prior to your workshop at the Welcome Center. The Welcome Center is open from 12-5:30PM on Sundays. You may leave your luggage on the front porch of the main office building if you arrive Sunday morning before the office opens. If you arrive after the office has closed, your lodging packet will be in the Information Kiosk, inside our main gate. We encourage you to plan your arrival so that you are able to check in while the office is open.

Check-out is by 10AM Saturday following the end of your workshop. Please return your room key to the key drop box at the front door of the Welcome Center.

SMOKING, DRUG AND ALCOHOL POLICY

Pitkin County law prohibits smoking (tobacco or marijuana) in any buildings or in any lodging at Anderson Ranch. Anderson Ranch is a smoke-free campus. The consumption of alcohol and/or marijuana is not permitted in the studios.

SPECIAL REQUESTS

Please let us know when you book your lodging reservation if you have any physical limitations with regards to walking, stairs, vision or hearing as this will help us to provide you with lodging that will best suit your needs. Anderson Ranch is unable to guarantee special amenities or room-specific lodging assignments. If you have specific dietary needs or food allergies, booking your own accommodations off-campus is your best option so that you have access to cooking facilities.

PARKING

Anderson Ranch has a shared parking lot available for guest use. Anderson Ranch guests may not park in any lots or spaces that are marked for apartment residents or the chapel.

LODGING

LODGING OPTIONS AT THE WYLY HOUSE DORM

Option 1: Private Room & Bathroom

- **Room Type:** Private room with twin bed and private bathroom.
- **Room & Board Rate:** \$1,920.10 per week (includes 13.05% tax) for six nights and select meals.

Option 2: Private Room & Shared Bathroom

- **Room Type:** Private room with twin bed and shared (possibly co-ed) bathroom.
- **Room & Board Rate:** \$1,501.81 per week (includes 13.05% tax) for six nights and select meals.

Option 3: Shared Room & Bathroom

- **Room Type:** Shared room with two twin beds and shared (possibly co-ed) bathroom.
- **Room & Board Rate:** \$925.26 per person, per week (includes 13.05% tax) for six nights and select meals.

CAMPING

Town of Snowmass Village ordinances prohibit camping in tents, RVs or vehicles (including car camping) on the Anderson Ranch campus and within the town of Snowmass Village. Camping is fairly limited within a 15- to 20-mile radius of Anderson Ranch. For general information about Forest Service campgrounds, please contact the Aspen Ranger District at 970.925.3445; they cannot take reservations, however, so to book a campsite from 6 months to 4 days in advance, please call 877.444.6777 or go online to www.recreation.gov.
