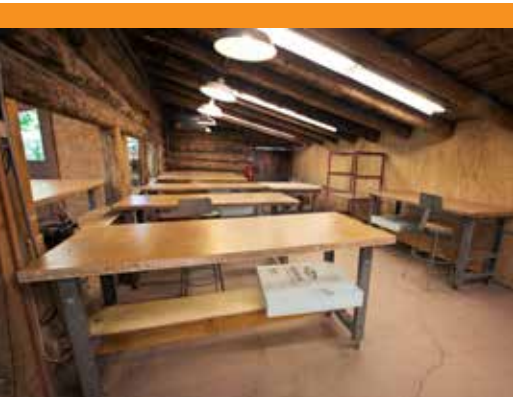

Workshops are the core of Anderson Ranch's programming and fulfill our mission by providing an invigorating immersion in creativity. The energy generated in our studios from the diverse mix of students of all ages and abilities pair with renowned faculty results in life-changing experiences.

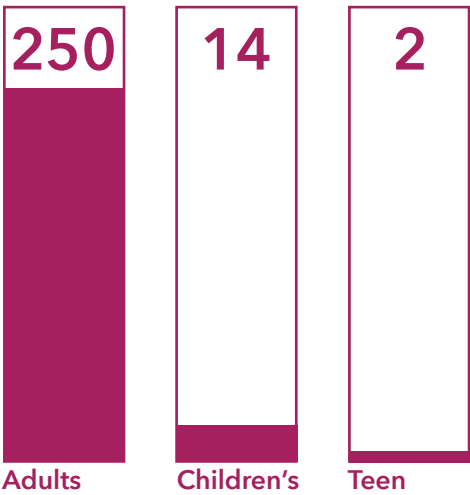

Anderson Ranch also partners with 130 colleges and universities to award scholarships to upper level aspiring artists. More than 20% of our workshop students participate on scholarship.
