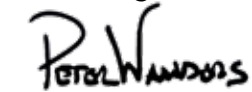
Our core offerings of workshops, residencies, and visiting artists programs were

SCHOLARSHIPS

Anderson Ranch is dedicated to offering opportunities to promising artists and increasing access to our programs for a diverse group of participants. Specific scholarships are funded by Ranch supporters, both individuals and foundations, either through endowed funds or special gifts. Scholarship applications are open to all. Anderson Ranch also partners with 80 colleges and universities to award scholarships to upper level aspiring artists. More than 20% of our workshop students participate with scholarship support.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

AFTER SCHOOL ART PROGRAM

A new after school art program for grades 1-4 on early-release Wednesdays. Activities include painting, printmaking, ceramics, photography, sculpture, and use of other mixed-media materials.

ART BREAKS

Art Breaks is an exciting program at Anderson Ranch Arts Center for artists ages 7-10. Programs are scheduled to complement breaks in the elementary school calendar throughout the year.

FESTIVAL DEL RANCHO

Celebrating Latine and Hispanic culture through art, dance, music, food, and more! This programming is made possible by a significant gift generously donated by the J. Christopher and Anne N. Reyes Foundation as well as funding from the City of Aspen.



PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP WITH PFLAG & ASPENOUT

A portrait photography workshop that encourages participants to investigate their motivations for making portraits, strengthen their skills working with people, and engage deeply with issues in contemporary photography through lectures, demonstrations, and critique.

TEEN PHOTOGRAPHY SCHOLARSHIP WITH PFLAG & ASPENOUT

A workshop that nurtures passion for photography through an atmosphere of exploration, practice and play. Students examine how great photographs engage their audience visually, emotionally and intellectually.



SCHOOL FIELD TRIPS

Anderson Ranch Arts Center offered field trips to 5th-grade students in the Roaring Fork Valley. Local Roaring Fork Valley students explored, created and interacted with art. A field trip to Anderson Ranch included a visit to campus and art-making in the studios.

YOUTHZONE TEEN SUMMER WORKSHOPS

In partnership with YouthZone, Digital Storytelling was a four-week workshop for eight graders to high schoolers. Students explored visual storytelling, memory and photography. The workshop culminated with a one-week gallery exhibition at the Patton-Malott Gallery at Anderson Ranch Arts Center.

OUTDOOR SCULPTURE EXHIBITION

Anderson Ranch Arts Center is pleased to present our third annual outdoor sculpture exhibition, entitled *From There to Here*. This iteration of the exhibition includes works by emerging and established artists, many with a personal connection to the Ranch, including past Summer Series speakers, Visiting Artists and artistic staff members. New works include contributions from artists Leah Aegerter, Sanford Biggers, Louise Deroualle, Jessica Stockholder and Tavares Strachan. We are also thrilled to welcome several new artists to the Ranch with sculptures by Isamu Noguchi, Virginia Overton and Nari Ward. Many of the works in this year's exhibition are socially and politically engaged, encouraging discourse and conversation about race, history, identity and belonging.

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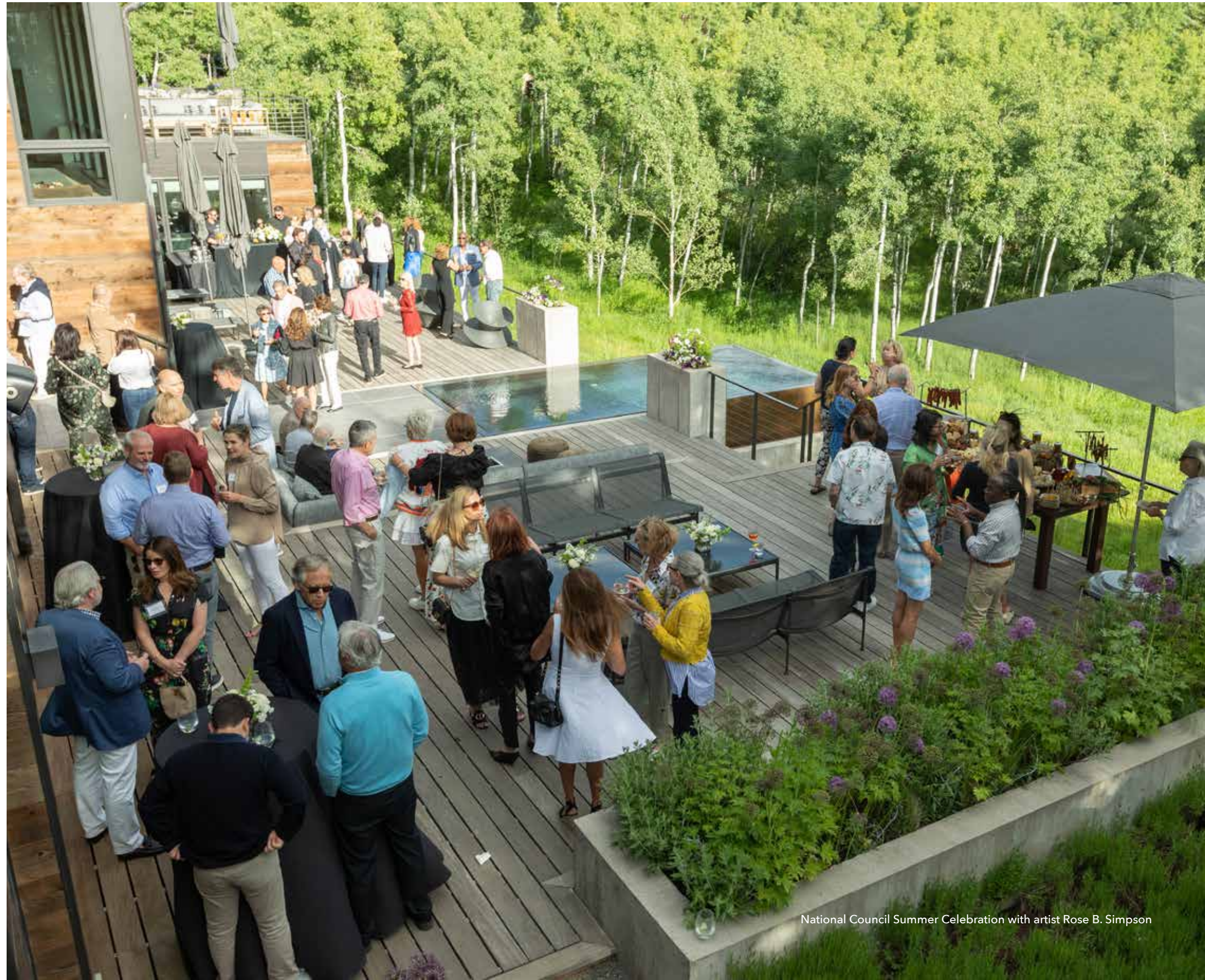

Her visionary leadership significantly enhanced Anderson Ranch's profile in the national art community, ensuring its stability and success. Ann cherished the Ranch as a place for creative exploration and interdisciplinary art-making, welcoming artists of all levels to a supportive and inspiring environment. Her steadfast dedication to the Ranch mission will have a lasting impact that will continue to enrich the Ranch community.

When asked about the importance of the Ranch, Ann once said:

It is cherished as a place to explore one's creative expression in an incredibly stimulating, supportive, and comforting environment. Artists of all levels are welcome here and have access to world-class facilities that encourage an interdisciplinary approach to art-making. It is a place where the local arts community gathers to learn and be inspired. (2016)

Betty played a pivotal role in shaping Anderson Ranch, serving as a Board member from 1993 to 1997 with unwavering dedication. JIM CROWN

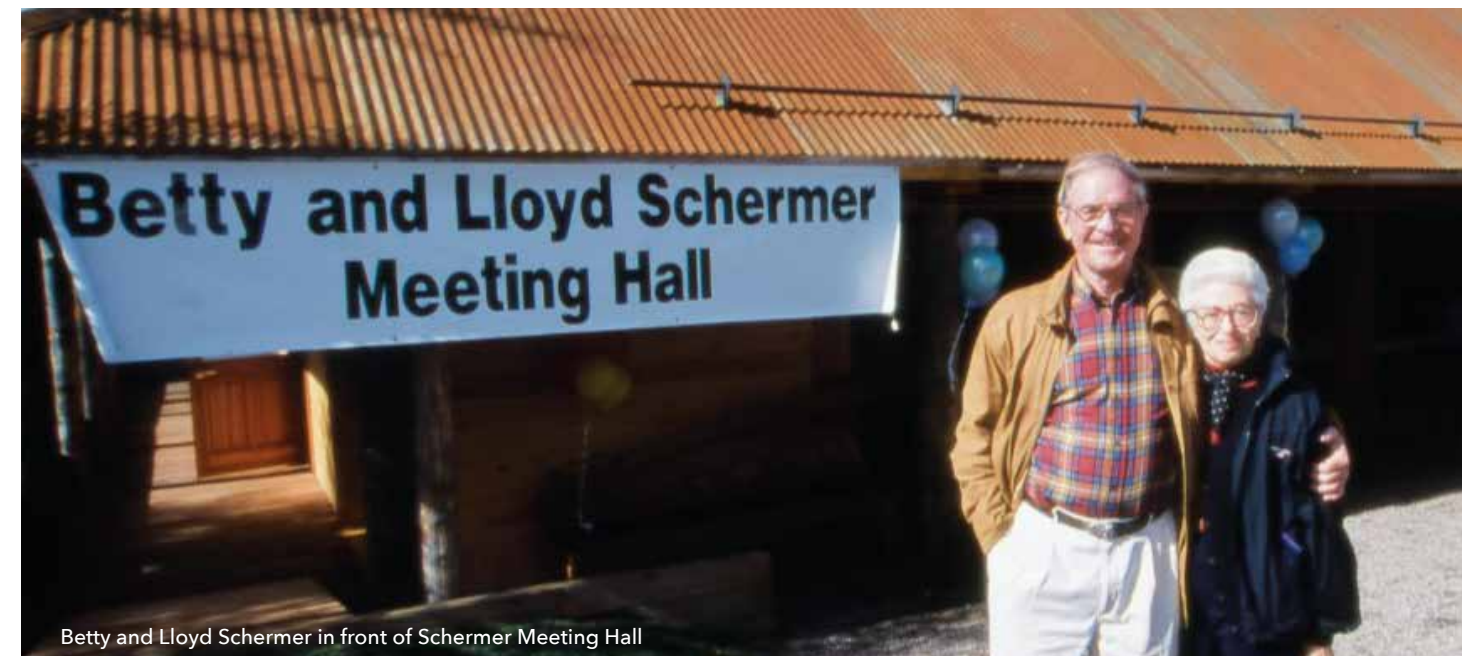
