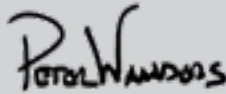

WINDGATE FOUNDATION INTERNSHIP GRANT

Through the generosity of the Windgate Foundation, the Internship Program at Anderson Ranch Arts Center offers transformative opportunities for emerging creatives, with the majority taking place during the summer workshop season. Interns receive hands-on experience supporting workshops, events, and special projects while also engaging directly with world-class artists, faculty, and peers in a dynamic studio environment. To ensure access and equity, the program provides housing, meals, and travel reimbursement, along with a \$5,000 Professional Development Award to further their artistic and educational pursuits. Interns not only gain technical and professional skills but also mentorship, participate in professional development seminars, networking opportunities, and a sense of belonging in the Ranch's creative community. The program continues to break down barriers and foster the next generation of artists.

Anderson Ranch is dedicated to offering opportunities to promising artists and increasing access to our programs for a diverse group of participants. Specific scholarships are funded by Ranch supporters, both individuals and foundations, either through endowed funds or special gifts. Scholarship applications are open to all. Anderson Ranch also partners with 80 colleges and universities to award scholarships to upper level aspiring artists. More than 20% of our workshop students participate with scholarship support.

YOUTH PROGRAMS & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

AFTER-SCHOOL ART PROGRAM

An after-school art program offered to grades 1-4 on early-release Wednesdays during the fall and spring semesters. Activities include painting, printmaking, ceramics, photography, sculpture, and use of other mixed-media materials.

ART BREAKS

Art Breaks are offered to artists ages 7-10, and are scheduled to complement breaks in the elementary school calendar throughout the year.

BRIDGES HIGH SCHOOL COLLABORATION

Acclaimed photographer and visiting artist Kathy Landeros led a collaborative project at Bridges High School, a school that lost its art funding. She guided students in creating photography to compliment their poetry, resulting in the exhibition *The Gravel Underneath*, which celebrated their resilience in a public show at the Anderson Ranch Gallery.

DAY OF THE DEAD AT PITKIN COUNTY LIBRARY

In partnership with Pitkin County Library, a Day of the Dead community workshop was hosted, educating participants about the cultural traditions and symbolism of this Mexican celebration.

EDUCATOR WORKSHOP

A free, one-day workshop for local educators featuring Latine Visiting Artists. Participants engaged in a studio workshop and received a custom Latine arts curriculum to bring back to their classrooms.

FESTIVAL DEL RANCHO

This event celebrates Latine culture through art, dance, music, food, and more! This programming is made possible by a significant gift generously donated by the J. Christopher and Anne N. Reyes Foundation as well as funding from the City of Aspen.

KIDSCULPT WITH ACRA

In partnership with the Aspen Chamber Resort Association (ACRA), Kidsculpt 2024 is part of the Wintersköi festival. Middle school teams created imaginative snow sculptures based on the theme *Rock Your Soul*, fostering creativity and community.

3RD AND 5TH GRADE FIELD TRIP PROGRAM

Offered to 3rd and 5th grade students in the Roaring Fork Valley. While visiting campus, students explore, create and interact with art. These field trips meet 3rd and 5th grade Colorado state standards in the visual arts.

2024 AEF PARTNERSHIP

In partnership with Aspen Education Foundation (AEF) to provide students with hands-on arts education. Through programs like photography workshops and art-science inquiry, students worked with professional artists, deepening their creative skills and confidence. This collaboration remains dedicated to fostering the next generation of artists and innovators.

YOUTH AND TEEN SCHOLARSHIPS

Partnered with regional high schools—including Rifle, Coal Ridge (New Castle), and Grand Valley (Parachute)—to fund scholarships for week-long summer workshops for students and teachers.

OUTDOOR SCULPTURE EXHIBITION

Anderson Ranch Arts Center is pleased to present our fourth annual outdoor sculpture exhibition. This iteration of the exhibition includes works by emerging and established artists, many with a personal connection to the Ranch, including past Summer Series speakers. Many of the works in this year’s exhibition are socially and politically engaged, encouraging discourse and conversation about race, history, identity and belonging.

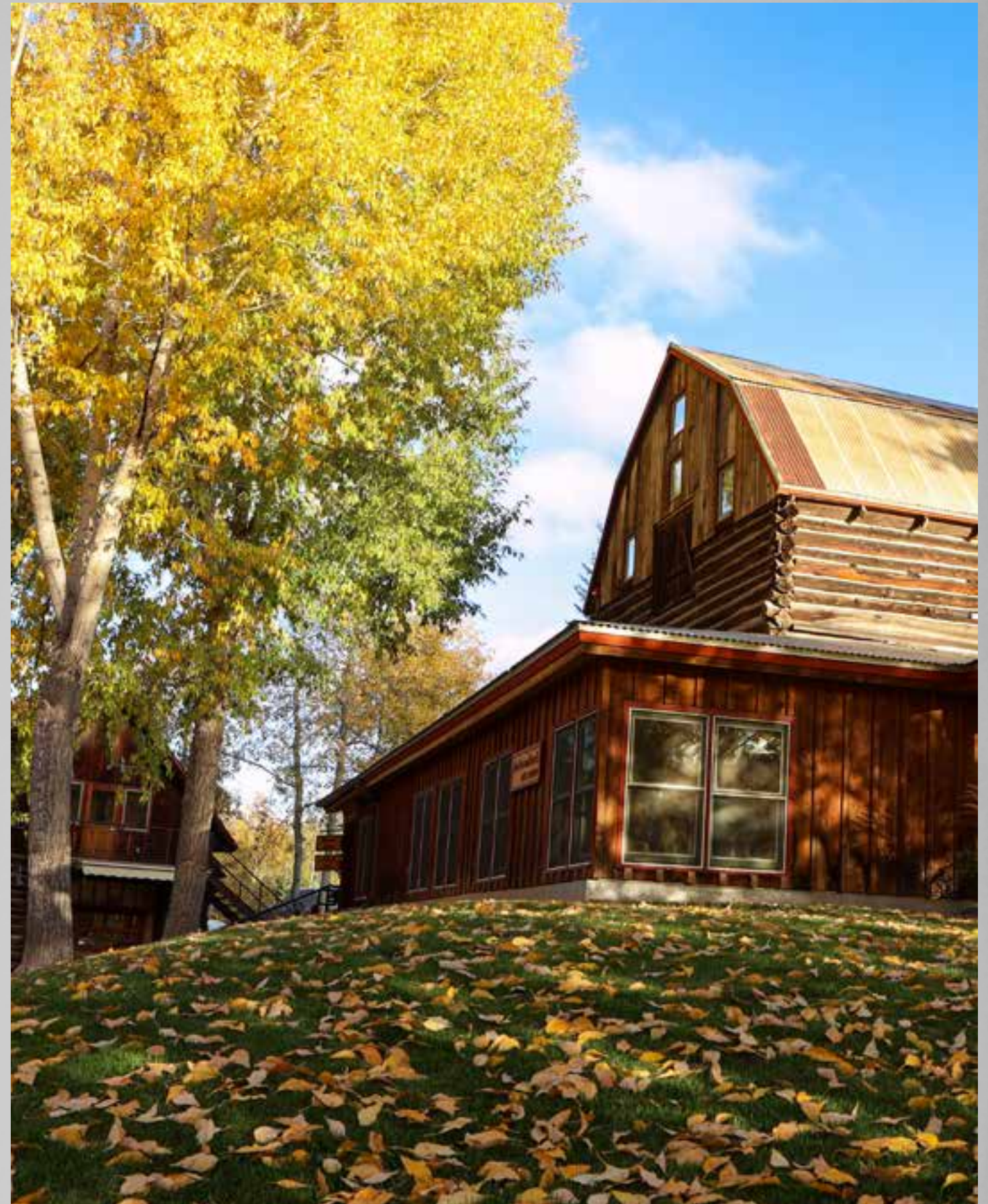

Together with her late husband Martin, she championed the construction of the Martin and Evelyn Siegel Children's Building, ensuring a permanent home for young artists. Well into her nineties, she was a Friday fixture on campus; visiting children in the studios, serving cookies and lemonade, and joining the Auctionettes. Honored with the Community Service Award in 2001, Evelyn embodied the generosity, warmth, and creative spirit that continue to guide the Ranch today.

TOM KOROLOGOS

A devoted friend of Anderson Ranch for more than 25 years, Tom, alongside his late wife, Ann McLaughlin Korologos, served on the National Council. They were leading supporters of the Photography and New Media program. An avid photographer for over 70 years, he took part in numerous workshops at the Ranch. This past July, we were honored to exhibit a selection of his images in the Patton-Malott Gallery, showcasing his journalistic eye and gift for finding beauty in everyday life. Tom had a distinguished career in public service, including his tenure as U.S. Ambassador to Belgium from 2004 to 2007. He will be remembered with admiration and affection by the Ranch community and beyond.
